LILSA Water Quality Education Survey Results



Total Survey Participants: 178 (77% from Lac Ste. Anne 24% from Lake Isle)

35% Shoreline Summer/Weekend Resident 22% Backlot Summer/Weekend Resident

19% Shoreline Permanent Resident

17& Backlot Permanent Resident

Half of the survey participants are not familiar with water quality of our community lakes and streams.

The overall lake water quality was rated a 3.5/5.

70% of users think the water quality has gotten significantly/a little worse.

78% of users think the algae/scum is the main issue with our lakes.

50% think the aquatic weeds and high nutrient run-off are also an issue.



Main actions people are willing to implement to enhance water quality.

- 1. Avoid using any fertilizers or pesticides near any water source
- 2. Retaining native vegetation and not introducing non-native or invasive species
- 3. Working with neighbors, community associations, and other groups (eg. LILSA)

Blue-Green Algae, Watershed Health, Lake Legislation, Invasive Species and Wildlife Habitat/Natural Shorelines



66% of users are not interested in participating in stewardship projects/activities related to the lakes
